

THE SECOND FIFTY YEARS: THE AUSTRALIAN ARMY 1947-1997

Major-General Kevin Cooke (rtd) was Commander, 3rd Division, 1981-85, and Chief of Army Reserve, 1985-88. His military career began in the Cadet Corps in 1945, and following the raising of the CMF he was commissioned into the Royal Australian Infantry. After his period of active duty he was Honorary Colonel of The Royal Victoria Regiment for six years, and he still serves on the National Council of the Defence Reserves Support Committee. In private life he has wide-ranging legal and business interests.

Professor Peter Dennis is head of the School of History at University College, Australian Defence Force Academy. His most recent publications are (joint editor and author) *The Oxford Companion to Australian Military History* (1995) and (with Jeffrey Grey), *Emergency and Confrontation: Australian Military Operations in Malaya and Borneo, 1950-1966* (1996).

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Dr David Horner is a Fellow in the Strategic and Defence Studies Centre at the Australian National University. He graduated from RMC Duntroon in 1969 and retired from the Army as a lieutenant-colonel in 1990. He holds an MA in history from the University of New South Wales and a PhD from the Australian National University, and is the author of many books on Australian military history, including *The Gulf Commitment* (1992) and *Inside the War Cabinet: Directing Australia's War Effort 1939-1945* (1996).

Dr Peter Londey is Acting Head of the Historical Research Section at the Australian War Memorial. A graduate of the University of New England and Monash University, he holds a PhD in ancient Greek history. Before joining the Memorial in 1991, he held positions at the University of Queensland and the Australian National University. He is currently writing a general narrative history of Australia's peacekeeping activities from 1947 to the present. He is also editor of the Memorial's magazine, *Wartime*, and joint editor of the *Journal of the Australian War Memorial*.

Brigadier MPJ O'Brien is Deputy Director of Studies at the Australian College of Defence and Strategic Studies. He has previously been Chief of Staff, Headquarters Logistic Command (1994) and Commander, Army Technology and Engineering Agency (1995- 96). He is the author of *Conscripts and Regulars: With the 7th Battalion in Vietnam* (1995).

Professor Robert O'Neill is Chichele Professor of the History of War at the University of Oxford and a Fellow of All Souls College, Oxford. A graduate of RMC Duntroon, he served as an officer in the Australian Army from 1958 to 1968. He was Rhodes Scholar for Victoria in 1961 and completed his doctorate in history at Oxford. He was the head of the Strategic and Defence Studies Centre at the Australian National University, 1971-82, and Director of the International Institute for Strategic Studies in London, 1982-87. Among his many publications is the two-volume official history, *Australia in the Korean War* (1981,1985).

Lieutenant-General John Sanderson was appointed Chief of the General Staff in July 1995. His previous position was Commander, Joint Forces Australia, following his appointment as military commander of the United Nations Transitional Authority in Cambodia, 1992-93. He became Chief of Army in February 1997.

Major Graeme Sligo is a staff officer at Headquarters 1st Brigade in Darwin. He has served with 1st Battalion, The Royal Australian Regiment, and in various staff and regimental appointments. He is a graduate of the Royal Military College, Duntroon, and of the Canadian Forces Command and Staff College, Toronto. He holds a BA (Hons) in History from the University of New South Wales, and an LLB from the University of Melbourne.
