WAGGA WAGGA

NOW - Wagga Wagga is one of Australia's leading regional cities with a population of 60,000 and is located in the centre of Australia's population triangle (Sydney, Canberra, Melbourne and Adelaide) and is the hub and major retail/industry centre of the Riverina.

Located on the banks of the beautiful Murrumbidgee River, the city is home to Charles Sturt University, Royal Australian Air Force Base and the Kapooka Army Recruit Training Centre. Wagga Wagga is a city of diverse opportunity and offers an attractive and enviable lifestyle with education, health, sport and cultural facilities comparable to the metropolitan areas.

THEN – The traditional owners were the Wiradjuri people and it is from their language that Wagga Wagga takes its name. Wagga means crow and the repetition of a word is their way of expressing the plural, a 'place of many crows'. In 1829, Captain Charles Sturt followed the Murrumbidgee River past the site of the current city. Three years later, settlers following his trail established cattle stations in the area. Within 20 years several villages had been established and the district grew. Wagga Wagga was proclaimed a town in 1849 and a city in 1946.

TRANSPORT

Air – Daily flights from Sydney and Melbourne. Regional Express and Qantas Airlines

Coach McCafferty/Grehyound & Firefly Coaches offer regular transport between Wagga Wagga and Sydney, Melbourne, Canberra and Adelaide.

Rail – The XPT travels from Melbourne and Sydney twice daily.

ACCOMMODATION

Wagga Wagga has over 2,500 beds in motels, boutique B & B's, serviced apartments, caravan parks and country pubs, there is something to suit everyone's budget.

LEISURE, RECREATION & SPORT

Stroll the wonderful parks and gardens, enjoy a game of golf, cycle the "bikeways", or take a nature walk along the banks of the Murrumbidgee River. An outing to one of the speciality markets, whether it is the Farmers Market on the banks of the Wollundry Lagoon or the Sunday Markets, makes for a pleasant experience.

Wagga Wagga is proud of its first-class sporting and recreational facilities. These, coupled with a very high level of community support in running the numerous sports bodies in the city, provide an excellent base for sports people to establish their careers. Visit Wagga Wagga's Sporting Hall of Fame, which recognises the outstanding achievement of local athletes who have reached the highest level of their chosen sport.

ART & CULTURE

With a myriad of facilities to awaken the artistic side in us all, visit the Museums, Art Galleries and Theatres - from traditional to contemporary, there is something to suit all tastes. Public artwork has also become one of the city's key features in recent years with superb sculptures dotted around the CBD and one must not forget the many fine buildings from the late 1800's that are located throughout the city.

NIGHT LIFE AND ENTERTAINMENT

There is a range of musical talent around the city and if you are looking for action "from sunrise to sunset", check out the various clubs and pubs on weeknights and weekends.

Moviegoers can catch the latest releases in the Forum 6 Movie complex.

FOOD AND WINE

A variety of cuisines are available in the restaurants and eateries in Wagga Wagga. So select from the formal dining experience to the alfresco café and sample some of the regions fine food and wines. If wine tasting is your flavour, head for the local wineries.

SHOPPING

The City is a major retail service centre for the Riverina Region, providing residents and visitors alike with shops ranging from national retailers to locally owned specialty stores. Late night shopping in Wagga Wagga is Thursday night with many shops trading till 9pm. You can also shop till you drop on the weekend with many retailers opening all or part of the day.
