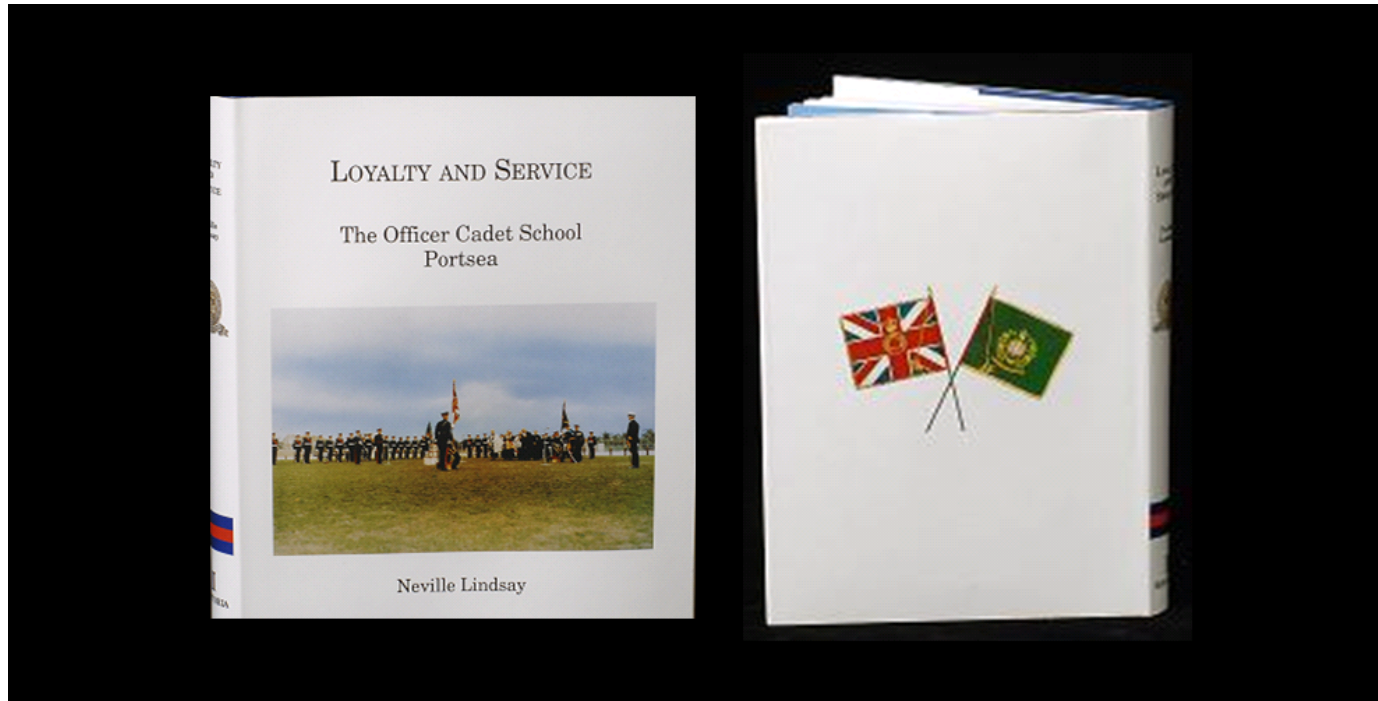
## The Royal Military College of Australia
